Bath Charter Township's Downtown Development Authority (DDA) is undertaking a study of Main Street in Bath's downtown, and would appreciate hearing your thoughts, opinions, and suggestions on this topic.

## **Sewer Projects Rate Increase**

Much of the sanitary sewer system was constructed in the early 1970's. And the concrete in the pipe is susceptible to corrosion from sulfides generated by the wastewater. Over decades, the corrosion has severely deteriorated much of the pipe – this was the cause of a sewer collapse and sink hole we had at the end of March (and an expensive repair).

The Township has identified pipelining to provide necessary structural support to the worst of the corroded pipes, reconstruction of Lift Station 203, and a number of smaller repairs and pump updates. We intend to use existing cash of \$1.5 million and bonding for up to \$2 million to pay for these projects.

In the near future, the Township Board of Trustees will decide on a sewer rate increase to cover existing operations and financing the repair work. There will be a double-digit increase in sewer rates. It will be significant but really is necessary and is cheaper than not performing the maintenance and repairs.
