CURBSIDE SERVICE FOR RESIDENTS 60+ AND/OR DISABLED

The Township will also provide a curbside-only service for citizens age 60+, or individuals who are physically disabled and can't bring their materials to the drop-off site.

Items must be placed curbside by 8 am on the day of your scheduled pick up. Crews will not enter your property to collect items. If you need help placing items curbside, there may be assistance available through Unity in the Community, a Bath High School program. 

Election Inspectors Needed!

Bath Township is in need of election inspectors - workers (paid) to assist voters at the polls on Election Day. Registered voters who are interested in serving as election inspectors must submit an Election Inspector Application to Bath Charter Township. Election inspector training will be provided by Clinton County in June 2014.

Election inspectors cannot be a challenger, candidate, member of a candidate's immediate family, or a member of the local Board of Canvassers. Anyone convicted of a felony or an election crime may not serve. Election inspectors are covered by the federal Minimum Wage Act.

Creation of Flag Lots Prohibited

Effective February 10, 2014, Ordinance No. 31.43 and No. 31.44 will become operational, amending the Bath Charter Township Zoning Ordinance. Ordinance No. 31.43 will prohibit the creation of flag lots and clarify conditions for the use of previously established flag lots. Ordinance No. 31.44 will permit private streets and roads only in commercial site condominiums, as well as delete the section of the Zoning Ordinance entitled "Private roads serving more than one lot" in its entirety.
