You can register online at www.bathtownship.us or call the Township Offices at (517) 641-6728, Monday through Friday from 8:00 am – 5:00 pm to register.

Dispose of household items – including furniture, electronics and appliances – at the Township during the Annual Tom King Memorial Junk Day. This is a FREE program to Bath Charter Township residents ONLY.

Space is limited and registration is required to participate. There is a two-load limit per address – a truck or utility-sized trailer (4-feet x 6-feet) load equates to one load. If unauthorized items are mixed in your load, our crews are not obligated to sort the materials and may refuse the entire load.

#### Curbside Service for Residents 60+ and/or Disabled

Curbside Registration is LIMITED: Qualified persons may call the Township Offices at (517) 641-6728 from March 25 – April 5, 2019 to schedule a pick-up appointment for April 8 – April 11, 2019. You will be assigned a pick-up date based on a predetermined schedule and the voting precinct that your residence is in.

Curbside-only service is for residents age 60+, or who are physically disabled and can't bring their materials to the drop-off site.

- There is a ONE-LOAD limit per address.
- Items must be placed curbside by 8:00 a.m. on the day of your scheduled pick up.
- Crews WILL NOT enter your property to collect items.
- If unauthorized items are placed for collection, our crews are not obligated to sort the materials and may refuse the entire load, leaving it on your property.



#### **REQUIREMENTS FOR DISPOSAL**

- Lumber and carpet MUST be cut to four-foot lengths or less
- Protruding nails in lumber MUST be removed or bent down
- · Large pieces of glass should be broken into a pail
- · Household/residential tires only
- Tires MUST be off rims, free of dirt and water; Up to 10 accepted

#### **Electronics Recycling – Accepted Items**

- PC Monitors
- Keyboards
- Hard Drives
- Printers, Fax Machines and Copiers
- · Televisions and other monitors
- Misc. Electronic (stereos, wires, etc.)
- Items not accepted for electronics recycling may still be eligible for disposal as part of this event. Please see Items NOT ACCEPTED during the event below.

- Liquids

# Flowers & Decorations in Township Cemeteries

Grave blankets and other types of winter decorations shall be removed by April 15, 2019.

Artificial flowers, shrubs, or similar ornamentation shall not be placed on the ground between April 15 and October 15. Artificial flowers may be placed in an urn if they are properly secured. Urns must be placed in line with the headstone or placed directly back of the headstone as close as possible.

Flowers may be planted only within 12" of the front of the monument or marker and under no circumstances will such planting be allowed outside the boundaries of the owner's burial space(s). # Bath & Laingsburg School Elections to the life of the

The Bath and Laingsburg Schools will be holding an election on May 7, 2019. Due to the historically low turnout for school elections, two of the precincts that serve the Bath School voters will be consolidated with another precinct. These changes are for this election only.

The consolidations are:

• Precinct #4: Bath School voters who normally vote at the Psalms 91 Church (located at 7501 Coleman Road) will vote at Precinct #2, Bath Community Center, 5959 Park Lake Road, Bath, Michigan. This building is located on the north side of Park Lake Road just east

of Webster Road in front of the Hawk's Ridge development.

 Precinct #5: Bath School voters who normally vote at the Bath Fire Station (located at 5633 Drumheller Road) will vote at Precinct #1, Township Hall, 14480 Webster Road, Bath, Michigan. This building is located just east of the Fire Station at the corner of Webster and Drumheller Roads.

The polls are open from 7:00 am until 8:00 pm on Tuesday, May 7, 2019.

### Take Back Meds at the Bath Police Department

The Bath Township Police Department is a drop-off location for the Take Back Meds Program.

The Program is a joint effort between local pharmacies, law enforcement, as well as government agencies to provide residents with safe, convenient access to proper medicine disposal.

Disposing of your medicines at our Police Department will ensure that your medicines will not be stolen from the garbage, will not enter our environment and deters abuse and overdoses at home.

#### How to Prepare the Medication for Drop Off

Bring medications in their original container. Do not remove the name of the medication. Pharmacy staff must be able to see the medication type so it can be properly sorted. Block out ALL identifying personal information on the prescription label.

#### Accepted at our Police Department Drop Box

- Pain Relievers
  - Vicodin, Hydrocordone, Demerol, Oxycodone, Fentanyl
- Anxiety Medication
  - Valium, Xanax, Zoloft, Prozac
- Sleep Aids
  - Ambien, Lunesta, Sonata
- Behavior Modification Medication
  - Ritalin, Methylphenidate, Adderal
- Cough Medication
  - with Dextromethorphan
- Illegal Drugs
  - Marijuana, Heroin, Cocaine
