**ORDINANCE DISSOLVING
BATH CHARTER TOWNSHIP DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY**

ORDINANCE NO. 63.2

At a regular meeting of the Township Board of Bath Charter Township, Clinton County, Michigan, held electronically via Zoom on June 21, 2021, at 6:00 p.m., Township Board Member Trustee Fewins-Bliss moved to approve the following Ordinance for a first reading, publication, and subsequent final adoption, which motion was seconded by Township Board Member Treasurer Wiswasser:

An Ordinance to dissolve the Downtown Development Authority for Bath Charter Township pursuant to the provisions of the Recodified Tax Increment Financing Act, Act 57 Public Acts of Michigan of 2018, as amended; to provide that the 2012 Bath Charter Township Tax Increment Financing Plan has no force and effect as of the date of this Ordinance; to transfer the surplus funds to the taxing bodies; to transfer the property and assets of the Authority to the general fund of the Bath Charter Township after the satisfaction of the obligations of the Authority; to repeal Chapter 23 of the Bath Charter Township Code of Ordinances; and to provide for other matters related thereto.

BATH CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF CLINTON COUNTY, MICHIGAN, ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. TERMINATION OF PURPOSES: The Township Board of Bath Charter Township hereby determines that it is in the best interest of the public to dissolve the Bath Charter Township Downtown Development Authority because the Authority has completed its purpose.

SECTION 2. DISSOLUTION: The Township Board of Bath Charter Township hereby dissolves the Downtown Development Authority for Bath Charter Township as of the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. DEVELOPMENT AND TAX INCREMENT FINANCING PLAN: Because the Downtown Development Authority for Bath Charter Township is dissolved, the 2012 Bath Charter Township Development and Tax Increment Financing Plan has no further force and effect as of the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. FUNDS: Pursuant to MCL 125.4215(2), the surplus funds of the Downtown Development Authority for Bath Charter Township shall revert proportionately to the respective taxing bodies.

SECTION 5. PROPERTY AND ASSETS: Pursuant to MCL 125.4230(1), the property and assets of the Downtown Development Authority for Bath Charter Township, exclusive of surplus funds, shall belong to Bath Charter Township upon dissolution of the Authority.

SECTION 6. PUBLICATION AND COPIES: The Township Clerk of Bath Charter Township shall promptly send a certified copy of this Ordinance, along with copies of the required publications, to the Michigan Secretary of State.

SECTION 7. SEVERABILITY: The provisions of this Ordinance are declared severable. If any part of this Ordinance is declared invalid for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction, that declaration does not affect or impair the validity of all other provision that are not subject to that declaration.

SECTION 8. REPEAL: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance, including, but not limited to, Chapter 23 of the Bath Charter Township Code of Ordinances, are hereby repealed.


SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon publication or posting after final adoption by the Township Board.
