Clinton Area Transit System Millage Proposal

Shall the Clinton Area Transit System (The Blue Bus), County of Clinton, Michigan, be authorized to levy annually an amount not to exceed .70 mill (\$0.70 for each \$1,000 of taxable value), of which .6924 mill is a renewal of the millage rate that expires in 2024 and .0076 mill is new additional millage to restore the millage rate lost as a result of the Headlee Amendment millage reductions, against all taxable property within the Clinton Area Transit System limits (the jurisdictional limits of Clinton County except for the area in the jurisdictional limits of the City of East Lansing) for a period of four (4) years, 2025 to 2028, inclusive, for the purpose of providing funds for all public transportation authority purposes permitted by law, including all capital and operating expenses and providing transportation services to all individuals within the Clinton Area Transit System limits, including seniors, persons with disabilities and veterans. The estimate of the revenue the Clinton Area Transit System will collect if the millage is approved and levied by the Clinton Area Transit System in the first year (2025) is approximately \$2,456,000?

<p>This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the building and site sinking fund millage that expires with the 2024 tax levy.</p> <p>Shall the currently authorized millage rate of .9551 mill (\$0.9551 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) which may be assessed against all property in Bath Community Schools, Clinton and Shiawassee Counties, Michigan, be renewed for a period of 10 years, 2025 to 2034, inclusive, to continue to provide for a sinking fund for the construction or repair of school buildings and all other purposes authorized by law; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2025 is approximately \$360,000 (this is a renewal of millage that will expire with the 2024 tax levy)?</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Yes</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> No</p>

Clinton County Regional Education Service Agency Special Education Millage Proposal
<p>This proposal will allow the intermediate school district to continue to levy the special education millage previously approved by the electors and restores millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963.</p> <p>Shall the currently authorized millage rate limitation of .2605 mill (\$0.2605 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation), on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Clinton County Regional Education Service Agency, Michigan, to provide funds for the education of students with a disability, be renewed for a period of 20 years, 2025 to 2044, inclusive, and also be increased by .0517 mill (\$0.0517 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 20 years, 2025 to 2044, inclusive; the estimate of the revenue the intermediate school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2025 is approximately \$873,448 from local property taxes authorized herein (this is a renewal of millage that will expire with the 2024 tax levy and a restoration of millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963)?</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Yes</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> No</p>
